



Ray Gurney started the presentation with a brief video describing the discovery of the Akhmim codex in Egypt in 1896. It was the setting for the gospel and demonstrated quick refutation that this is a "Gnostic" gospel.

Ray is holding "The Gospel of Mary Magdalene" in one hand; in the other is a book made by Tanya Schwartz-Roeper depicting the Coptic bookbinding technique developed in the 2<sup>nd</sup> century.

#### Worship Service April 22 with Brian Smith Religions and the Environment



Brian began his presentation acknowledging 4/22 is the 48th anniversary of the first Earth Day celebrated on this date in 1970 at the initiative of Wisconsin US Senator Gaylord Nelson. Brian explained how this movement began in the 60's and continued to gain momentum into the 2000's with Congress' taking action and passing legislation to curb air and water pollution, manage

solid waste more carefully, and protect endangered species. He pointed out, however, that in recent years the momentum to protect the earth has slowed, especially in our own country. He shared readings from Vaclav Havel, the renowned Czech defender of democracy and human rights in the late 20th century; Walt Whitman, 19th century American poet; Barbara Deming, the 20th century American Quaker, journalist, feminist and peace activist.
