### ENGAGE Sunday February 16 with Robert (Spud) Hannaford "A Life Well Lived"



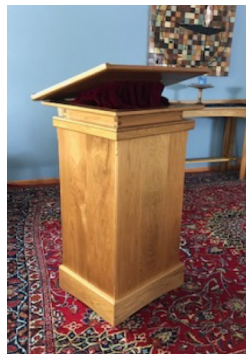
Thank you to Spud Hannaford for leading a very engaging ENGAGE Sunday! It started with a question, "Can we explain or suggest how to attain a life well lived?" Hannaford went on to say, "I assume we can agree that we would not say that a person had a life well-lived unless they lived in accord with certain ethical standards." Participants shared

standards of what they believe people must live by to have had a life well lived. The list included: Courage, commitment, vulnerability, integrity, honesty, empathy, compassion, positivity, self-knowledge, love, and live by the Golden and Platinum rules.

Interpretation of the three quotes below were also part of the discussion:

1. "At the moment of commitment (to a project) the entire universe conspires to assure your success." by Johann Goethe
2. "Happiness is the exercise of vital powers, along lines of excellence, in a life affording them scope." by Aristotle
3. "Loneliness is the absence of accepting the joy of social responsibility." by Nadine Gordimer

### Worship Service February 23 with Professor Paul Jeffries "Learning from Heroes, Saints, and Sages"



We welcomed back Paul Jeffries. Paul is Associate Professor of Philosophy at Ripon College and presented "Learning from Heroes, Saints, and Sages." We explored how we might live more ethically excellent lives by following the examples set out by what Linda Zagzebski calls

moral exemplars. Her approach to understanding ethics attempts to develop a theory of the virtues, both moral and intellectual, that is grounded in our experiences of admiration of those who live lives that teach us what it means to be excellent human beings.

There was special programming for children and youth religious education classes. Following the Girl Scout *World Thinking Day Activity Guide*, the children learned about the 2020 theme of "Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion." PLUUF helped the Girl Scouts expand their understanding of the immense diversity in our Global Movement. Thank you to Becky Feyen for assembling the materials and Robyn Davis Bartow for teaching the class. For Story For All Ages, Paul Jeffries read the book, "The Other Side" by Jacqueline Woodson. This was a story for young readers to relate and think about the history of segregation.
