


Worship Service Sunday, August 14, 10:00 AM Plus Potluck Topic and leader to be announced.

A Message from the Moderator by Robyn Davis-Bartow



Greetings fellow PLUUFers! Hopefully, this month's newsletter finds you having an enjoyable summer so far. One of the best things about being a UU this time of year is MUUSA! Every year during the first week of July, the Midwest Unitarian Universalist Summer Assembly takes place in the Missouri Ozarks. 2022 marks my third time being able to attend this camp for all ages over the past ten years. As some of you may know, the summer assembly used to be held in Lake Geneva, WI, before it transitioned to Trout Lodge YMCA camp two hours southwest of Saint Louis. Because of these Wisconsin roots, a number of WI natives make the trek for a week's worth of UU services, inspired workshops, tear inducing vespers, hands-on crafts, singing, dancing, raucous laughter, and family friendly fun. I encourage all to consider attending in 2023. (PLUUF road-trip anyone?) Though I could talk at

length about the amazing community MUUSA creates for any and all who attend, I am narrowing my message to the greatest take-away gleaned from the daily morning service.

This year MUUSA was blessed with having Dr. Glen Thomas Rideout, the Director of Worship Ministries from First Universalist Church of Minneapolis, as the Theme Speaker for the week. A dynamic and talented presenter, performer, and singer, Glen had us singing, laughing, and crying with every service. But it was a seemingly small ritual that we also perform at PLUUF on traditional Sundays that inspired me the most each morning. He lit the chalice. But he did not simply light the chalice and read chalice lighting words. He challenged us with *chalice lighting words* and lit a light that transformed a rustic camp hall into a treasured sacred space. Glen held us accountable. Responsible. Each morning he demanded that within the space created by the lighting of the chalice we would be our best selves. He called on each one of us to be accountable, responsible for bringing our best self forward and accepting nothing less. In the silent transition between enthusiastic musical celebration and simple, deliberate, and reverent ritual, a community of hundreds honored this command and each other by rising to the challenge. The love and respect held for all in that space was palpable. It flowed out into the rest of the day and trickled home with us all.

I challenge all of us to create this type of sacred respect whenever the chalice is lit in our own small but vital fellowship. I challenge us to practice rising to and maintaining our own best self one service at a time. To honor boundaries and set judgment aside. I want us all to experience the warm, safe, and honored container created by trusting each other to do their own part. What I love most about Glen's charge is that he did not lecture. He did not explain what he meant about being one's best self. He did not engage in a lengthy debate about etymology, psychology, or epistemology. He simply respected himself and others enough to simply say let it be so. And it was.

Jean Johnson not only co-founded Prairie Lakes UU Fellowship, she served as PLUUF's program planner, Moderator twice, board member, worship service committee, the minister search committee, representative of the Ripon Area Ministerial Association (RAMA), and many other roles. We are grateful for her dedication, knowledge and inspiration to help make Prairie Lakes what it is today.

Jean received her medical degree from the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine at a time when only 6% of the students were women.

Jean had a passion for skiing, canoeing and nature. She died on April 29, 2017. When her husband Harry passed away earlier this year, a gift of \$10,000 was given to Prairie Lakes. The canoe/kayak adventure on Spring Lake is our way to honor Jean's memory.

Prairie Lakes hosted Timothy Cordon while he made a tour stop in Ripon. In 2020, social distancing and wearing masks, Building Unity drove a 34' Motorhome, dubbed the "Votemobile", over 3,000 miles around Wisconsin to engage and register voters.

Sadly, we are witnessing the steady erosion of our democracy as gerrymandering, voter suppression, partisanship and misinformation threaten to undermine our institutions and the very foundation of our democracy. The Vote. Building Unity took the Votemobile back on the road this summer with the message that Your Democracy Needs YOU. We are grateful Prairie Lakes had an opportunity to host Timothy Cordon and support his message.
