# ENGAGE Sunday, August 20, 10 AM: What's New at the UUA led by Becky Feyen

The Unitarian Universalist Association General Assembly was held at the end of June and there are several exciting developments to share with you: The UUA has a new President! I will share a bit of background on Rev. Dr. Sofía Betancourt.

In addition, we will review the new article II structure of the UUA bylaws for 2024, which outlines 6 UU values based around *Love*:

Interdependence | Pluralism | Justice | Transformation | Generosity | Equity
Our current version of the 7 Principles was introduced in 1985, replacing the Purposes &
Objectives of 1961 (6 Principles – looking at these might make you realize, someday
someone will read on our current Principles & understand why they were updated). This
latest proposed transition incorporates the 8<sup>th</sup> Principle statement within the structure of
these values. The Living Traditions is being replaced with an expansive definition of
Inspirations.

There were several Actions of Immediate Witness for social justice support. Love it or hate it, social justice is the backbone of Unitarian Universalist values & actions. We will discuss what role, if any, we want to play in supporting the resolutions or anything else that supports the growth of our Fellowship.

### Jean Johnson Memorial Kayak/Canoe Adventure

Saturday, September 2, 10AM

The 2nd Annual Jean Johnson Memorial Kayak/Canoe Adventure will take place Saturday, September 2, at 10AM at the Spring Lake landing in Green Lake. Participants will paddle across Spring Lake and through a cattail marsh to get to the Tichora Conservancy property. Kayaks/canoes will be pulled onto shore and participants will hike to the Green Lake side of the Tichora Conservancy for a potluck picnic brunch.

There are two ways to participate in this event:

- 1. Kayak or canoe from the Spring Lake landing at Spring Valley Park in Green Lake and paddle to the Tichora Conservancy property. When you arrive at the Tichora Conservancy property we'll pull your boat onto shore and hike approximately a 1/4 mile to the picnic area.
  - 2. Drive to the Tichora Conservancy property and take a short walk to the picnic area
    - <u>Kayak/Canoers</u> will meet at the Spring Lake landing at Spring Valley Park: W2290 Spring Lake Road, Markesan by 9:45. (You can Google Map it by typing in Spring Valley Park, Markesan, WI). Be sure to bring a life jacket and water bottle.
    - If you choose to drive to the Tichora Conservancy property the address is: W2580 Oakwood Beach Road, Ripon. Plan on arriving by 10:30. (If you Google Map it, type in Camp Grow Ministries, Ripon, WI) We'll be setting up a picnic area near the shore of Green Lake and it's an easy walk from the parking area.
    - If you want to follow Tanya: She lives just 8 minutes from the landing and about 12 minutes from the Tichora Conservancy property. If you prefer to follow her <u>please arrive at her house by 9:30.</u> Address: W907 Scott Hill Road Ripon. It's the driveway just west of the highway's A & K intersection and it's the driveway with the horse sculpture. You will follow her to the Spring Lake landing. From there you'll either launch your boat or continue to follow her in your vehicle to the Tichora Conservancy property.

Jean Johnson not only co-founded Prairie Lakes UU Fellowship, she served as PLUUF's program planner, Moderator twice(!), board member, worship service

committee, the minister search committee, representative of the Ripon Area Ministerial Association (RAMA), and many other roles. We are grateful for her dedication, knowledge and inspiration to help make Prairie Lakes what it is today.
