I thought I would update you on the wonderful experience I had at the Immanuel United Methodist Church Community Dinner. The kitchen is perfect for these events, large commercial stove, refrigerator & DISHWASHER! There were 2 men that managed rinsing & washing the dishes.

The meal consisted of a barbecue sandwich, tater tots, cheesy veggies, coleslaw, pickles, fruit, & a variety of desserts. A selection of drinks, water, lemonade, sweet tea, milk, & coffee. The people walked through 2 lines & the food was served on nice/real plates & flatware. The tables had place mats & floral arrangements.

The leaders & volunteers were super nice, they had the people who are not familiar with their process serve the food. There were 2 lines for people to walk through. I also helped get drinks for people in the beginning. After I finished serving the meal, I walked around clearing tables & replenishing drinks.

The attendees were predominantly older people, but there were some young families. I am estimating approximately 80 people were served, could be higher or lower. After the meals were complete people could come through the line to take meals home in provided to-go containers.

I left around 6:15 & others were still finishing up in the kitchen.

In Memory of Rev. Jim Jaeger

James (Jim) Jaeger passed away on May 16, 2024, after a six-year battle with Lewy Body dementia. Jim started his career working as a lawyer for the IRS. In the early 1980s Jim left the IRS and the whole family moved to Madison, WI, where he helped pioneer the field of Elder Law and was an early adopter of the use of technology in law practices.

Jim always had a calling to the ministry and realized that calling when he was ordained as a Unitarian Universalist Minister in 2016. Several members of Prairie Lakes attended his ordination ceremony in Madison. He loved serving several small UU churches in Southern Wisconsin and working as a Hospice Chaplain after he retired from his law practice. Prairie Lakes was fortunate to have Jim as our quarter-time Consulting Contract Minister from September 1, 2013 – June 30, 2016. Not only did Jim lead 2nd Sunday Worship Services at Prairie Lakes, he led Adult Religious Education sessions and provided care and comfort to a couple of PLUUF members battling serious health issues at the time.

His wife Karen preceded him in death. Karen often accompanied Jim on his trips from Madison to Prairie Lakes. A memorial service celebrating Jim's life will be held June 22, 2024, at 4:00PM at First Unitarian Universalist Society in Madison, WI.
