

Each year, the Unitarian Universalist Association chooses one or more books as a Common Read, asking congregations across the denomination to consider reading and discussing the same book in a given period of time.

With this year's kit of Common Read resource materials, the UUA is pleased and excited to invite Unitarian Universalists into conversation with transgender and nonbinary people—and their partners, parents, children, siblings, and chosen family members—whose interviews and portraits fill the Skinner House book, *Authentic Selves: Celebrating the Lives of Transgender and Nonbinary People and Their Families*.

The subjects of *Authentic Selves* share their own stories, speaking from different stages of life, different regions of the country, different faith traditions, and different places on the rainbow spectrum of gender

identity. Their book invites readers into their lives' revelations, challenges, joys, and networks of support.

In Unitarian Universalism, with Love at the center of our shared values and Pluralism, Interdependence, Generosity, Transformation, Justice and Equity alongside, sharing our stories with one another can be a deep and faithful experience. Let the storytellers of *Authentic Selves* teach, affirm, and inspire you. Then, join this year's UU Common Read to share your own stories in community and form a deeper understanding of how your own gender identity has shaped your life.

#### October Board Meeting Minute Highlights by Board Secretary Michaela Meyers



In this month's meeting, the Board discussed approval of the Annual Report. Tanya did a great job putting together visual representations of attendance and membership metrics. We also continued the conversation about improvements to PLUUF's facilities, including finalizing the plans for shelves in the RE room.

The Board reviewed notes from a meeting that took place on Sunday, September 29, about the Sharing Garden. It involved much discussion about the future of the Sharing Garden and how it can be used to best serve PLUUF and the greater community moving forward. A big thank you to Judy Morgan for creating and managing the Sharing Garden over the last 4 years! Beth and Connie are working on creating a map of the grounds that will detail which plants are placed in what beds in an effort to better understand what care and maintenance will look like. We're also going to be getting a shed for storing some larger tools and gardening items outside. Brody Roost has agreed to install it and add customization as necessary.

Connie reported back on her RAMA meeting and talked about how she and Becky participated in one of the Tuesday night Sharing Table dinners. The Board discussed if this was something PLUUF wanted to commit to doing in the future and it was added as an option to the Talent & Interest Sign Up sheet, which everyone is encouraged to fill out (see page 2).

And finally, The Board went over our Welcoming Congregation status. With Becky's book discussion of <u>Becoming Nicole</u>, a book that had a lot of very persuasive science in it, and PLUUF's donation to Ripon High School's Social Justice Alliance (SJA), PLUUF only needs to donate to one more organization to maintain its Welcoming Congregation status. The current plan is to donate to Ripon College's Queer Straight Alliance (QSA). The Board also discussed potentially doing a future event collaborating with Ripon High School's SJA and Ripon College's QSA to do something to show support for those communities and/or provide further education around queer topics.




## Are You Interested in Joining a Casual Meditation Group?

ENGAGE Sunday, October 20: A Free and Responsible Search for Truth and

**Meaning** George Gonis of First Unitarian Society of Milwaukee is a Civil Rights activist, historian and journalist. He discussed the Civil Rights icon and Hollywood star Frederick March. March is at the center of a controversy involving actions taken by the University of Wisconsin based on a social media rumor that March was a Klan member and a white supremacist. In response to the unfounded rumor, the UW stripped March's name from the theater in the Memorial Union. Mr. Gonis followed the story and with new information and

support from some 60 Civil Rights leaders attempting to reinstate March's name to the theater, the UW remains unmoved and steadfast in the decision even in the face of the truth. Mr. Gonis focused on UU's 4th Principal, while sharing the background of this remarkable story. (Thank you to PLUUF member Kathryn Severson for coordinating this event)



Worship Service Sunday, October 27: <u>Day of the Dead</u> with Judy Morgan Back by popular demand, Judy led this event for the 4th year in a row! This event is celebrated throughout Latin America. It's a holiday of joyful celebration rather than mourning. The sharing of photos and stories of loved ones who have passed away highlighted this special event. The kids had a special RE/Youth Group session to learn more about the Day of the Dead. Plus, they drew pictures of loved ones who have passed and shared with the congregation.
