
A MORNING OF FUN and FUNDRAISING

At the UUA General Assembly in June 2024, UUs voted to replace existing Seven Principles and Six Sources language in the UUA bylaws with language describing Unitarian Universalism through these shared values: Interdependence - Pluralism - Justice - Transformation - Generosity - Equity. Not everyone at Prairie Lakes was comfortable with this change and Rev. Phil Lund will not only lead a May Worship Service, he will be available to answer questions and discuss the change from the 7 principles to the 6 shared values. More details to come!

Speaking of love, Jim also shared his experience of attending the Grounded, Resilient and Responsible webinar as part of the Side with Love series and he said it had lots of good information in it, much of which was in line with Becky Feyen's service on how to live our values courageously that was presented on March 9 (see recap on next page).

The board also celebrated receiving \$1500 from the Webster Grant with the money going to Summer RE/Youth Group and Tapestry of Faith materials!

And of course, we all enjoyed the last little bit of light that was still out when our meeting ended and looking forward to the longer days as we move into spring!

Would You Like to "Adopt" a Raised Garden Bed at PLUUF?

Many thanks to Judy Morgan for creating the PLUUF Sharing Garden several years ago. She donated the raised garden beds, tended the beds, harvested, and donated the veggies to the Traded Treasures Food Pantry.

Now that Judy has retired from tending the garden beds, we are looking for individuals to take over by adopting a bed (or two). By adopting a bed, you decide what to plant (vegetables, herbs, flowers) and how you would like to use

what you grow. For example, the flowers you grow could be picked and taken home or maybe used as a bouquet for a PLUUF service. The same with vegetables and herbs. You can grow them for yourself, or share with PLUUFers, or donate to the food pantry, etc.

ENGAGE Sunday, March 2, with Sherman Leatherberry & Pat Dobrinska: "Inner Worlds, Outer Worlds" Part III. In "Inner Worlds, Outer Worlds" Part 3, titled "The Serpent and the Lotus," the focus was on the concept of the "inner serpent" representing our primal desires and unconscious patterns, while the "lotus flower" symbolizes the potential for spiritual growth and enlightenment that can arise from confronting and integrating these shadow aspects within ourselves; exploring how ancient myths and spiritual traditions across cultures often depict this duality through symbolic imagery, emphasizing the importance of balancing the two forces to achieve inner harmony and a deeper connection to the universe.

According to *Inner Worlds, Outer Worlds*, a 2012 documentary directed and produced by Canadian meditation teacher Daniel Schmidt, it is believed that all religions are just different manifestations of the same universal ideas. The root belief of all religions is that there's a field of energy linking the inner spirits of individuals to the

external world.



Worship Service Sunday, March 23, "Rethinking how to Repair our Broken World" with Connie Ghinazzi One of our topics at the Board Retreat in January was about mending relationships among our families, our friends and acquaintances in these fractured times. Many of us feel exhausted. This service explored some ideas about this topic from our new worship resource, Soul Matters. Here is the quote from David Levithan that got me started on this service. "...Then it hits me. Maybe we're the pieces... Maybe that's it. With what you were talking about before. [Tikkun olam] The world being broken. Maybe it isn't that we're supposed to find the pieces and put them back together. Maybe we're the pieces... Maybe, what we're supposed to do is come

together. That's how we stop the breaking.
